"For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven"

- Ecclesiastes 3:1

Dear All,

Time famine, or time poverty, is the feeling of not having enough time to do all you want to. Sleep, work, childcare, cooking, cleaning, shopping, gardening... the list goes on. Even those who are retired often find themselves complaining that they don't have enough hours in the day. Our time is precious and many of us will feel robbed when we lose an hour with the changing of the clocks this month.

Amid our busy, clock-watching lives we often find it hard to devote time to prayer, reflection, and worship. We plug along, promising ourselves that tomorrow will be different, while knowing that it will not be. But if we care about someone or something enough, we will find a way to make time. I'm not saying this to make anyone feel guilty. It's just a fact of life.
