From our minister:

"All who exalt themselves will be humbled, and all who humble themselves will be exalted." – Matthew 23: 12

Dear All,

John Calvin (1509-1564) was the French pastor, theologian, and reformer who based his ministry in Geneva during the Protestant Reformation. Today he is remembered as the principal figure in the development of the system of Christian theology that bears his name: *Calvinism*, which was at the heart of the Scottish Reformation and is still to be found in the theology and practices of The Church of Scotland today.

It was a privilege and a blessing to celebrate the 25th anniversary of my ordination to the Ministry of Word and Sacrament on Sunday 19 March. And 25 years of ministry has taught me that the Church and its people are at our best when, like Calvin, we abandon our "know-it-all" mentality and embrace a "learn-it-all" curiosity.

Our faith includes many heartfelt convictions, but that doesn't mean that we have all the answers. We grow in our faith and our relationship with God when we stop recycling the old answers that we learnt off by heart and start asking new questions of ourselves and our beliefs. When adopting an open mind, we quickly discover that there are many more questions than we had previously

imagined, and that coming to faith might mean we experience a greater alertness to life and to the holy than we've known ever before.

After 25 years of ministry, I still have much to learn and many questions that remain unanswered. However, I hope and pray that I will keep my own "teachable frame" and always encourage others to do the same.


