
PILRIG St PAUL'S CHURCH SEPTEMBER 2023

From our minister:

A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. – Isaiah 11: 1

Dear All,

Despite attempts to save it, the apple tree in the manse garden was uprooted during the recent strong winds and heavy rains. The fallen tree had to be cut up and removed, resulting in a garden that is now more open to the skies and less sheltered from both the sun and the rain. We tried hard to save the apple tree. We pruned it, to rebalance the weight of the branches, we cut out the dead wood, and we tried to prop up the main trunk. But nature had other plans and is already responding to the new opportunity it has been given. The grass which was previously under the tree is growing much healthier, and a young apple sapling is growing more vigorously to occupy the space left vacant by its predecessor. The garden is changing to become something new, something different to what it was before.

As a Church we are often bad at embracing change and seizing new opportunities when they come along. Congregations across the country find themselves putting more and more energy into propping up activities, traditions, and groups to keep them going, when perhaps the time has come to let them fall and be replaced with something new. The current Presbytery Plan will change the landscape of the local church considerably and it is up to us if we try to keep the old ways going or embrace the chance to become something different than we are now.

It's difficult to say precisely what historical event, if any, lies behind the image of the "stump of Jesse". There are a significant number of events in the history of God's people to which the prophet Isaiah may have been speaking. But despite their feelings of loss and uncertainty he offered the people a vision of a new and better future growing out from the remains of their past.

Change is not always easy, especially when we must learn new ways of doing things. However, it provides us with the potential to create a better future by responding and adapting to the opportunities before us. The manse garden will continue to adapt and thrive, despite the loss of the old apple tree. The church too, will continue to adapt and thrive in our new surroundings, if we are prepared to make the changes we need to.
