From our minister:

Dear All,

Some people like to travel light. They take the minimum number of items with them when going away. They count the number of days they will be away and pack just that number of pairs of socks, etc. No more and no less. While others have an "in case" attitude towards traveling. They will pack numerous different outfits to cover any possible changes to the weather, planned activities, and social engagements that may or may not occur while they are away.

Jesus was clearly in the former category. When sending his disciples on their first journey without him, he gave them instructions about what they should take and what they should leave behind. The list was brief and certainly didn't contain any "in case" items.

Some people believe that Jesus gives this advice to his disciples so that they would learn to trust others. It was Jesus' way of encouraging them to engage with the people they met. After all, when you don't have enough to go on, you must turn to those around you for what you need.

But there is another possible explanation. The items that Jesus told his disciples to leave behind are the same items that worshipers were told to leave outside the temple before they entered. People were to divest themselves of their money, their sandals, their cloaks, and staffs before stepping on holy ground. So, when Jesus told his disciples to travel light, he was perhaps encouraging them to approach the whole world as if it is holy ground, a place where they could expect to encounter God.

Every time we leave our homes, we decide what to wear and what to take with us – whether we are heading to do the weekly shopping,

to meet friends for a coffee, or going to work. What if we stepped out into the world each day with the mindset that we were going to be stepping on holy ground? Not dressed in our "Sunday Best" as if we were going to church. But as if we were going to encounter God in every place, in every moment, and in every person we met. What then?
