From our Minister:

"As for me, this is my covenant with you: You shall be the ancestor of a multitude of nations. No longer shall your name be Abram, but your name shall be Abraham, for I have made you the ancestor of a multitude of nations."

~ Genesis 17: 4-5

Dear All,

When Abram was ninety-nine years old, God appeared to him and made a new covenant with him. As a sign of this covenant Abram was given the name Abraham, and his wife Sarai given the name Sarah. These new names signified a new chapter in their lives and in their relationship with God.

Likewise, the congregation at Pilrig St. Paul's has undergone numerous changes of name since 1843 - each one signifying a new chapter in the life and history of the congregation and our evolving relationship with God. As we prepare to start the next chapter in the life of our congregation along with our neighbours at St. Margaret's and Leith, St. Andrew's, we will mark this with another new name. This is the name that will be used to cover the united parish of the three churches and our shared ministry. No decision has been made to rename any of our existing church buildings and these will remain unchanged at present. The name that was overwhelmingly selected by all three congregations is "Leith and Restalrig Church of Scotland". The name fits with the criteria (explained in previous issues) that we must use, but more importantly it contains some strong symbolism for us all. Leith and Restairig Church, provides us with the acronym LARCH, which we hope to use going forward.

The Larch tree is a deciduous conifer, which means it is one of the very few conifers that doesn't remain evergreen throughout the year. Just before it drops its needles in Autumn, the Larch turns a beautiful fiery gold/yellow in colour. This is suggestive of the emblem of the Church of Scotland, the burning bush in which God appeared to Moses. The fact that the Larch tree drops its needles every year and regrows new ones each spring, means that it is continually renewing itself. This can be seen to symbolise the motto that helped to define and shape many of the Reformed Churches across Europe, including the Church of Scotland, "ecclesia reformata semper reformanda" which means 'the church reformed and always reforming'.

As a symbol for the new parish the Larch reminds us that we need to keep God at the centre of all that we do (The burning bush) and that we need to keep renewing ourselves (*semper reformanda*) as we continue to grow in our ministry. We look forward in faith, hope and love to the new opportunities that await us in worship, fellowship, and service in the next chapter of our congregation's life.

Steering Group report for joint service - February 2024

Here is a brief update on what the Steering Group has been working on, ahead of the union of our three congregations later in the year. The Steering Group has been meeting monthly and is made up of the clergy team plus two representatives from each congregation.

As you know, under the Presbytery Plan, Leith St Andrew's building is to be released by December this year. The Steering Group is hoping to have all the required arrangements for the union put in place by October so that everything can be finalised by the end of the year.

There are a lot of practical issues to be sorted out such as what will happen to all the physical things owned by each Church, what will happen to the groups currently meeting in each Church, what manses will be retained, who will be on the ministry team, what will happen to the current staff across the three congregations, how do we bring together our financial resources, how will all the current committees and teams such as property, finance, pastoral care and so on come together. Some of these decisions will be made by Presbytery, not by the Steering Group or Kirk Sessions. There is plenty still to think about and a lot to organise in a relatively short period of time.

I can tell you that after much discussion and weighing up the advantages and disadvantages of the buildings, the three Kirk Sessions have chosen St Margaret's building to be the main worship centre. This means we expect Sunday morning services to take place there following the union. Pilrig St Paul's building will continue to be used, though when and for what purposes is still to be decided.

And finally, I can now tell you that the vote for a new name at the Congregational Meetings following worship on 21st January resulted in a clear favourite, by a majority. The name chosen is Leith & Restalrig Church. As well as clearly indicating what area we will serve, it could give rise to the acronym LARCH. The larch tree is a deciduous conifer and before it drops its needles in Autumn, they turn a beautiful fiery colour, perhaps suggestive of the emblem of the Church of Scotland, the burning bush. The fact that the Larch tree drops its needles every year regrowing them in spring, means that it is continually renewing itself. This could be seen to symbolise the motto that helped to define and shape many Reformed Churches, including the Church of Scotland, "ecclesia reformata semper reformanda" which means 'the church reformed and always reforming'.

As we continue to work towards the union of our three congregations, we ask for your prayerful and practical support. This is not an easy time for us as individuals, as congregations or indeed for the Church of Scotland. Whatever happens, we should try to look forward in faith.

This was presented to us by Joanne Baird, Session Clerk Leith St Andrew's Church at the joint service on Sunday 4th February 2024.

Members will be kept up to date as more details are announced.
