From our Minister:

So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them, and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

- Mark 16:8

Dear All,

The four gospels all agree that Jesus died and that his body was laid in a tomb. But then they diverge. Each one gives us a slightly different account of what happened next. The gospel of Mark finishes abruptly with the women fleeing in terror from the empty tomb. The gospel of Matthew has Jesus appearing to the women at the empty tomb and then to his disciples in Galilee. The gospel of Luke has Jesus appearing to two of his followers on the road to Emmaus and then to his disciples in Jerusalem, before leading them out to Bethany where he ascends into heaven. The gospel of John has Jesus appearing to Mary Magdalene at the empty tomb, then on several further occasions to his disciples in Jerusalem and by lake Galilee. It looks as if we have one story, but with four different endings!

Such differences and discrepancies have resulted in many people questioning the gospel accounts over the years. But here's the truth: It doesn't matter. The authors of the gospels weren't trying to write endings to their gospels that matched neatly with one another. Instead, they were writing beginnings. Each of the gospel accounts describe how different people experienced Easter in their own unique way.

The same is true today. Easter is not a history lesson with a tidy ending. Easter is never the end of the story. Instead, it is an invitation for us to have a new beginning in our lives. This new beginning will take different forms and will have different storylines for each one of us – depending on our own lives and situations.

This Easter I hope that the resurrection of Christ has a transforming effect on your own life – that you too will have the potential for new beginnings and a new relationship with God.
