Dear All,

Spring has sprung! There are blossoms on the branches and flowers appearing in the gardens. Green leaves are developing on the trees and the grass is growing. The gardeners among you will know only too well that this heralds a period of increased activity. Grass and hedges need to be cut and trimmed. Old growth needs to be pruned back. Seedlings are planted and emerging shoots need to be trained and supported.

The same can be said for the gardens of our lives. God may have planted the first seeds of love in each of us and provided us with the support and encouragement that we needed to grow, but we still need to look after ourselves. Whatever the season, and whatever we are having to weather in life, there is always work needing to be done.

At the start of another season in the church calendar we are invited to take time to tend the gardens of our lives – to weed out the things that suffocate our love; to prune back the feelings that shade out our compassion; and to feed and nourish all that is good in our lives, so that we may grow, blossom, and bear the fruits of our faith. As Jesus said, 'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit... Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing.' (John 15)

It is the same too for our church community. If we wish to grow and flourish, we need to reflect on where we need to weed and prune; and what we need to feed and nourish as we look towards the union of Pilrig St. Paul's, Leith St. Andrew's, and St. Margaret's. As part of this process, we need to reflect on the ways in which we care for one another; how we use the talents of everyone in the tasks we do; and how we serve the community in which we live, work, and worship.

As the Steering Group seeks to pursue new ventures and new ways of being the church to our local community we will be asking for your help and support, so that together we may bear the fruits of our faith in the gardens of our lives and the community of our church.

Our faith reminds us that when prayers and people are brought together great things can be achieved. Grafted into the life of Christ, and the lives of one another, we have the power to make many of our plans come true, as we work side by side to share the good news of God's love across our local community.

As you know, Crossreach offers many and varied services to help those in need all over Scotland. It occurred to me, however, that you might be interested to know about the work which Crossreach does right here in our home town of Edinburgh. The scope and diverse nature of the services offered is, I think, quite amazing, as you will see from the list below.

THRESHOLD

20 Westfield Avenue Support at home and day opportunities for adults with learning disabilities.

ESKMILLS The Gate Lodge 27 Milton Road East Supported accommodation for adults with learning disabilities in Musselburgh and Portobello. Support at home for those learning disabilities.

MORLICH HOUSE 11 Church Hill 23 bedroom residential care home for older ladies.

QUEEN'S BAY LODGE 49 Milton Road East 28 bedroom residential care home for older people. THE ELMS 148 Whitehouse Loan Residential care home for older people with dementia. Dementia Clinics provide training for families on caring for a loved one with dementia.

RESPITE CARE All care homes can provide respite care.

HEART FOR ART Charteris Centre 140 The Pleasance and Morningside Parish Church 2 Cluny Gardens Creative art groups for people with dementia.

CROSSREACH PERINATAL SERVICE

8a Palmerston Place Confidential perinatal counselling and therapy for anyone suffering due to pregnancy or early parenthood.

SUNFLOWER GARDEN Simpson House 52 Queen Street Counselling for children and young people affected by drug and alcohol use in their families.

COUNSELLING AND RECOVERY SERVICE Simpson House 52 Queen Street Confidential counselling and recovery services for adults affected by drug use. CROSSREACH RANKEILLOR 10 Palmerston Place Accommodation, advice and support for people moving towards more secure and settled housing.

CUNNINGHAM HOUSE 205 Cowgate Safe and supportive hostel accommodation for up to 2 years for homeless adults.

If anyone would like further information about any of the above services, I will do my best to help.

Our Christian Faith tells us that love should be the driving force behind all that we do. In the work of Crossreach, we see what can happen when that love translates into action. Lives can be and are being transformed, and many in need can be touched by comfort and hope. Crossreach is, in part, funded by the offerings which you give Sunday by Sunday, and so I hope, dear members, that you feel that you play a part in what Crossreach is doing.
